

Dutch Postcard

Christmas Table Runner Center Part 5

What you'll need:

- 2 strips of Delft blue fabric measuring 12.5 x 1.5 inches
- 8 white blocks of fabric measuring 3.5 x 3.5 inches
- Red fabric 4 x
- Green fabric 4 x
- Delft blue for the bow.
- Rulers, rotary cutter, water soluble pen, chalk pen or frixtion pen, pencil, needles,
 - scissors and pins, yarn
- Fusible web
- The template

Here is only one pdf , that is part 5.0. You can also appliqué by hand or with fusible web. There are no seam allowance when you choose hand appliqué. I find that the templates are small for hand appliqué. But or all the hero's here!

Traditional

Cut out the 8 white blocks. Draw and cut out the red and green balls, don't forget the seam allowance. Sew in balls the right place on the block. Cut the bow from leftover blue and decorate the ball as you see fit. Sew the green and red blocks together alternately and iron. Sew both borders on the existing quilt and iron. Then finish on both sides with a blue strip. Sew and iron. On to the final round!

Raw edge

Cut out the 8 blocks. Draw the red and green Christmas balls on fusible web and cut out. Place the pieces of fusible web on the back of the fabric and iron. Cut out of the fabric and iron in place in the white block. Draw the bow and any other ideas for decoration on fusible web, cut out, iron on fabric and cut out. Stick it in the right place on the block and iron. Sew everything with a small zigzag stitch or blanket stitch. Sew 4 blocks of green and red alternately together and iron. Sew both borders on the existing quilt and iron on. Then sew the blue strips on both sides and iron. You are now ready for the final round.
