

Quilt Along: Dutch Postcard Table Center Plecoweek 2 Tulips and border 1

What you'll need:

- Orange fabric 2 types
- Green fabric 1 type
- Blue fabric for the edge
- Orange and green yarn]
- Fussible Web

- Rulers, rotary cutter, dissolvable pen or chalk pen, pencil
- Needles, scissors, sewing machine with quarter inch foot or setting.
- The template on pdf

Raw edge applique

If you're like me, with little time to spare, you choose raw edge applique, you can draw the figures on fussible web without any seem allowance and iron and cut them out on the fabric. Only the middle part of the tulip needs to be cut a little larger so that it falls neatly under top of the rest of the tulip. I cut out the template of the all tulips on it and put this on a light box and put the fabric over it to mark with a chalk pen or frixion pen where the tulips should go. First iron the middle part of the tulip, then rest of the tulip over it. Draw the leaves on fussible web, iron on the fabric and cut out. You place the leaves as you like it. Then there will be another tulip on the blue part. That's the middle seize tulip. The tulip sits about 3/4 inch above the blue part. Keep in mind, there must be enough space for all the leaves. Sew everything with a small zigzag.

Needle turn applique

Cut out all parts with seem alloance. Use the template to position the tulips. I used a light box, template on light box, fabric over it and draw with a pen on the fabric where the tulips should go. To the parts on the fabric. Above the blue part is a tulip (the middle size). The tulip sits 3/4 inch above the center of the blue area. Make sure you leave enough space for the leaves.

Border 1

There are two pieces on the template, cut them out and glue them together, then you have 1/4 of the circle. The border is a little less than 2 inches wide inluding seem allowance. Place the parts on top of the fabric and use a frixion pen or chalk pen to put the outline on the fabric. Cut out, you can choose to add 2 halves or pin the entire border to the circle. Sewing and ironing.
