

Block 12 A lot of Triangles



What you'll need:

- Different colors of fabric.
- Scissors, Rotary Cutter, Ruler, Pencil
- Pins, needles, yarn by color
- FPP paper and fpp ruler
- The templates

You can choose between FPP or traditional.

FPP

Please note that if you use fun-dation, the sheets are shorter than the A4 I use. So it doesn't quite fit. What I often do is if I have empty space from another sheet of paper to cut it off and temporarily stick it to the fpp pattern and copy the pattern with a pencil. That often saves a sheet of paper.

Print out the pattern. Place the fabric in the right order and sew. Using an fpp ruler, trim away the rest and iron. And so you follow the rest of the pattern. The pattern consists of 5 parts. Once you have all the parts ready, put them together with ironing in between and your block is finished. I always leave the paper until the moment I put the quilt together.

TRADITIONAL

You need 16 small triangles, 8 large and 1 square. Cut out the templates and trace on the fabrics you have chosen. Cut everything out and put the large triangles together. Then put the small triangles together and make a square. Iron everything and make strips of 3 x 3. If you have the three rows, you put them together. Iron and you're done.
