Quilt Along: Dutch Postcard Wall Quilt Fan Blocks Traditional or FPP

What you'll need:

- 6 x blue, per part 4 x 3 inches (note with FPP it may be a little more)
- 6 x white, per part 4 x 3 inches (note with FPP it may be a little more)
- 4 x blue quarter circle, per part 2 x 2 inches. Or 1 large circle
- 4 x white quarter square, Per Part 4 x 9 Inches
- Yarn, I use off-white polyester
- FPP paper, I used fun-dation, but it can also be tea paper.
- Rulers, rotary cutter, dissolvable pen or chalk pen, pencil
- Needles, scissors, sewing machine with quarter inch foot or setting.

Traditional

Place the template B on the fabric and draw the outline on the fabric. Cut out. Do this 6 times and sew the white and blue alternately. Hand or sewing machine. Iron everything. You can put the 4 quarter parts of the circle on fabric, cut them out and put them together and then place them in the middle and secure them in the circle. I cut the circle into a whole. Folded the allowance inwards and sewn it in the middle by hand.

FPP

Print the template for FPP, the quarter circle 4 times on Fpp paper. Cut the fabrics and sew them alternately on the template. Put the four pieces together (remember to use a small stitch) and iron. You can cut out the quarter circles and put them together and then place them in the middle, or you can attach them to the quarter parts. I used a whole circle and sewed it in the middle by hand. Iron everything. Then comes the square. If you put all the parts together, the total of your square comes to 16.5 inches
